## **Timeline**

13<sup>th</sup> April 1570-Guy Fawkes is born 24<sup>th</sup> March 1603- King James I becomes King of England

**May 1604**- The group begin to plot against King James I.

26th October 1605-Lord

Monteagle receives an unsigned letter that warns him not to go the opening of Parliament.

**5**<sup>th</sup> **November 1605**-Guy Fawkes is found in the cellar with 36 barrels of gunpowder by the king's guards.

**31**<sup>st</sup> January **1606**-Guy Fawkes is executed.

## **Key Knowledge**

Bonfire Night is a celebration that you used to have to attended by law.

King James I was a protestant like Queen Elizabeth I.

Catholics were treated very poorly during this time. They were made to attend Protestant churches and if they didn't then they were punished harshly.

Lord Monteagle received a letter warning him to not go to the Houses of Parliament on November 5<sup>th</sup>. He took this letter to the king and this is how Guy Fawkes was caught.
